



Use a project management system.

Understand working styles of everyone on the team and be an empathic listener.

Apply steady, constant pressure to team members — don't be overbearing, let the project happen but keep it on track.

Have clear milestones and stick to them.

A brief should be just that – brief. Create one so the focus is not lost.

Use branding guidelines to back up your work.

Communicate consistently and frequently to the clients, the designers, the developers, and everyone in between.
